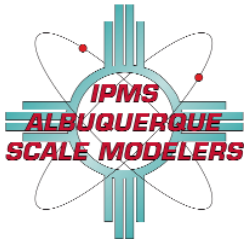

## PRESIDENT'S CROSSHAIRS BRIAN PECK

Greetings!

We start off the New Year with fresh ideas and new model projects. What are your modeling goals for the 2005? Is it building that awe-inspiring fully detailed battleship, that scratchbuilt 1/15 scale M1A1, or to finish 5 kits per month? Whatever your goal is, I hope you reach it. My goal for the year is to make a big dent in my growing collection by power building. Most of us buy more than we can make, which isn't a bad thing. Power building (AKA shelf fodder) can be a fun experience if you get a good kit to start with, and it has rewarding results. Most of the newer prop 1/48 scale Tamiya kits and Hasegawa kits are excellent kits to do

this. With an average price between \$20 – \$40 these kits are good "Straight out of the Box" candidates. Good fit and detail are trademarks of the Tamiya/Hasegawa kits and generally can be built in a week or two, out of the box, with some persistence. One good thing: the more you build the better you will get, and when you do start that super-detailed project you'll have the skills to complete it. Try it—you'll like it!

In club news, we decided to put on a Regional Contest for 2006. We've got the "skeleton" for a Regional and experienced ASM members so it won't be much of a problem to put one on. A couple of ASMs have already expressed interest in chairing the contest along with several other members willing to be on the committee. One side effect was that we

had to raise the club dues to get additional capital to pay for the contest. The increases are \$10 (total of \$30) for adult members and \$10 (total of

\$35) for family, but juniors will remain at \$10. The increase was to offset the initial startup cost of a Regional; i.e., facility costs, advertisements, etc. Although a \$10/year increase may seem dramatic, the projected \$700+/- from the dues increase should flow back into the treasury for

### December "Between the Wars" Special Contest #3 Results

The December meeting was a busy night with three contests. The primary event was the "Between the Wars" special contest, which had 23 total entries. The secondary event was the annual showdown for "ASM Model of the Year" in each of the four divisions. The third event was the Group Build contest, where teams of two or three members contributed to completing a specific model.

Stan Johnson was presented a plaque as a token of ASM's appreciation for the great support that we have received from Hobbies 'N Stuff. Thanks again, Stan!

The "**Between the Wars**" winners were as follows: The Best Overall Entry award went to Dave Straub's scratchbuilt Sikorsky S-38A. Best Basic Entry went to Jeremy Connell's F-8E "Crusader." In the Intermediate division, Best Entry 1919 - 1938 went to Jim Guld's "Learning to Crawl," which featured a Panzer IA. The Best Entry 1946 - 1959 went to Walt Schanwald's Douglas D-558.1 "Skystreak." In the Master's division, the Best Entry 1919 - 1938 went to Dave Straub's Sikorsky S-38A. Dave Miller's Pak-75 Howitzer won the Best Entry 1946 - 1959 award. Unfortunately, there were no Junior entries.

### ASM 2004 Model of the Year Results

The Model of the Year showdown had 21 total entries on hand representing the Best of Show winners from the seven 2004 theme contests, and the

future use if our Regional contest is successful. Most well-run contests generally at least pay for themselves or even will make a profit so there is little to worry about. All of our major contests in the past have been successful and I have confidence that this one will be a success too. The increase is only officially in effect for two years and will be reviewed by the '07 ASM e-board to decide whether or not the rate needs to be kept or not.

The Masters division was a particularly hard judge, with three models being in close contention down to the wire. The Masters Model of the Year was won by Dave Miller's truly outstanding 15 cm Panzerwerfer 42 auf LKW Opel "Maultier."
